CCD Overview

CCD Overview

- **CCD is a data warehouse that holds current and archived data from Consular Affairs (CA) domestic and post databases worldwide, including visa data from American Citizen Services (ASC), Immigrant Visas (IV), Nonimmigrant Visas (NIV), and other repositories.**
- **Information is updated in near real time**



Benefits of CCD Use

By checking CCD information, the adjudicator can compare an applicant's immigration history ensuring a consistent immigration history is reported to both DOS and USCIS. CCD stores information on:

- Marital Status/History
- Children
- Special Terms and Condition on Visas
- Travel History
- Employment and Educational History
- Purpose of Visa and Plans in the US

Benefits of CCD Use – Form I-526

- **Known risks related to alien investor program in general**
- **Enhancing vetting efforts through testing additional tools**
- **Unique adversarial threats**
- **Assessing credibility by identifying inconsistencies in self-reported data**
- **Integrate security precepts with adjudication processes**

Confidentiality

- **Subject to the “Third-Agency Rule”**
- **Maintain the confidentiality of visa records (CCD data) as described under Section 222 (f) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA)**
- **Privacy Act of 1974**
- **Must have a “need to know”**



Confidentiality (cont.)

- DoS visa records are generally **Sensitive But Unclassified (SBU)**
- Generally, USCIS may not disclose visa records without DoS approval, except as provided in the USCIS-Consular Affairs Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) (2006) and/or the DHS-DOS MOA (2008) and according to INA 222(f).


Use of “Live Data” During Training

- **This training may include the use of “live data” – PII that identifies real people with real cases.**
- **You are given access because you have a need to know this information for an official purpose.**
- **The information must be handled with respect and in confidence.**
- **Follow the directions of the instructor on use, handling and safeguarding of the data.**

How to Gain Access to CCD

- You **MUST** self register at <https://CCDI.state.osis.gov> before submitting your request.
- IPO officers (non-FDNS) should request CCD access for the “DHS/USCIS/OFO” user location.
- Go to and open myIT on your desktop 
- **Select Browse myIT, CCD (under popular items)**

NOTE: A new DHS Rules of Behavior form is required annually.

Mandatory Training

- Before accessing CCD, you must complete the mandatory training in CCD (before or after you login)



Indicators *may* be found in Case Notes, which are the notes of Consular Officers:

- Critical Point: Do NOT use Case Notes in RFEs/NOIDs/etc.; these are often the mental impressions or observations of Consular Officers, and may NOT be revealed to Petitioner/Counsel without prior DOS approval
- Case Notes can reference "SAO" or "TAL"
 - SAO – Security Advisory Opinion
 - TAL – Technology Alert List

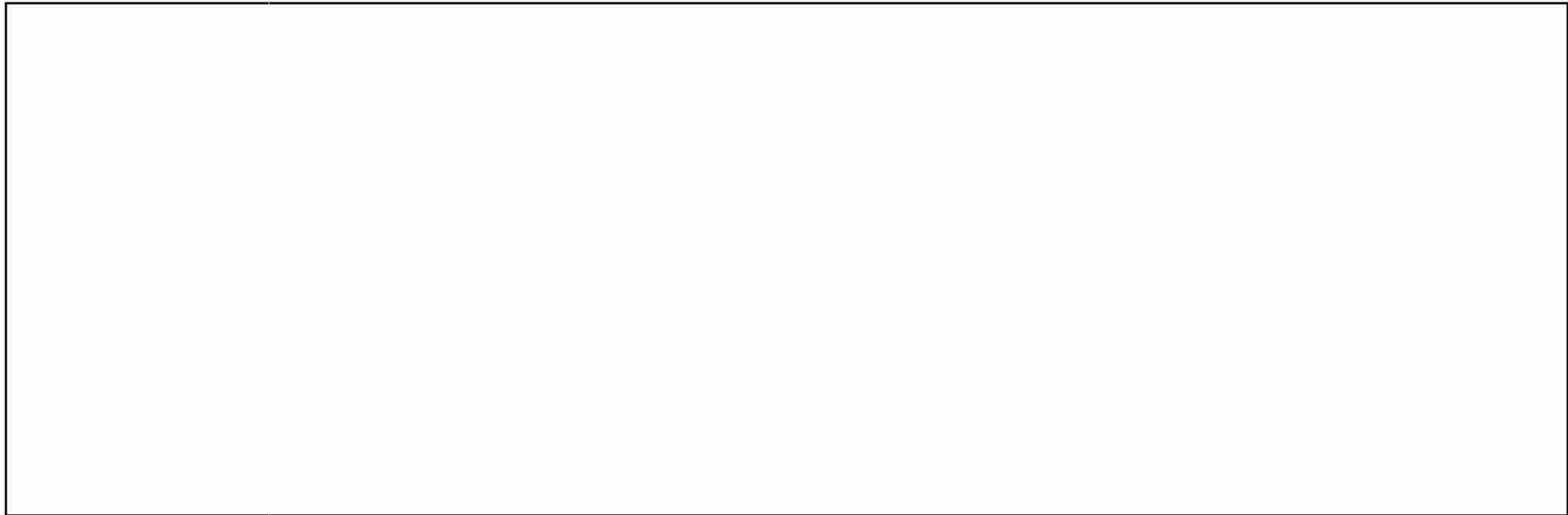

Communist and Totalitarian Party Inadmissibility Grounds

- **Policy Manual, Volume 8 – Updated October 2020**
- **In general, unless they meet an exception, any intending immigrant who is a member or affiliate of the Communist Party or any other totalitarian party (or subdivision or affiliate), domestic or foreign, is inadmissible to the United States.**

CCD Pilot Data Collection

- **IPO adjudicators will answer CCD related questions for each Form I-526 filed by a PRC national.**
- **The responses will be collected on the IPO ECN.**
- **OP&S and FDNS will use the data collected from the CCD checks to prepare a report on findings and recommendations for the Office of the Director.**

ACEs I-526 Adjudications Worksheet Update

- **The ACEs I-526 Adjudications Worksheet and Instructions have been updated and are effective as of 4/28/2021.**
- **The CCD drop down menu in the required checks section includes updates to capture more specific issues including the date that CCD was checked and the addition of NS Indicators.**
- **Where negative information found in CCD impacts the adjudication, the MD requires that you print a copy and place in the right-hand side of the file. See MD 214-001, Section IV.D.1: Management Directive 214-001**
- **The ACEs I-526 Adjudications Worksheet and Instructions update will be discussed on Tuesday 4/27 at the ECN walk-through.**
